

Class: 21st CENTURY DOCUMENTATION

In your own words you will begin to evaluate and write your quilt history. Ever thought about it before now? One hundred years from now, what you write in a journal or on a quilt surface will be your legacy to future generations. "Remember me when this you see" has resonated through our quilting lives and yet, it was just 6 words inked onto fabric in 1846. The agenda includes: How to collect oral history. How to journal about yourself. Making a personal quilt registry. Idea exchange. Collection of patterns for person documentation. Lettering in ink and fabric. Class is unique and personal. It is saturated with hands-on and information. Cost of class: \$40.

Skill Level: All

KIT fee \$12: includes 20 or more printouts, Fabric stamped samples and pre-cuts

Class Prep:

- Select a tightly woven muslin or white/cream cotton, etc. Cut one strip 3 ½" x WOF
- Select a Print, Cut two strips 2" x WOF
- Join all three with the solid strip in the center. Press seam to print.
- Ends may be uneven, no matter...bring to class.
- If available, for Show and Tell, bring a documented piece to share.

Tools and Equip:

- Fabric PENS (Pigma Micron .05 and .03) black and/or sepia. Other colors optional
- Small MATT and ROTARY
- Clear CLIP BOARD
- X-FINE SHARPIE or like
- FABRIC you have, that you think might be good to write on...to analyze and play!
- Soft cover/3 ring – 1" NOTEBOOK, Page Protectors (20-30)
